year ago, we were rushing to get ready for a trip to Chile to visit Edgar, Angela and their four children, Lucas, Daniel, Carolina and Sofia. As a result, we never finished our Christmas newsletter. This year, we'll try to cover the major events of these past two years.

Ghislaine broke her hip in February 2011. Surgery was successful, but she still suffers a lot of pain nearly two years later. She decided to "retire" after about 14 years of teaching Portuguese at the University of Tennessee, but after a semester decided to teach again, this time Spanish at Pellissippi State College.

In June 2011, son Thomas was diagnosed with lung cancer. The cancer which was in an early stage and had not spread was successfully removed. Afterward, he quit smoking, took up sailing and now spends most weekends on his sailboat on the Chesapeake Bay. More than a year after the operation, he is still doing fine. He and Cleusa still live in Springfield, Virginia, near Washington, D.C.

In August, we had the sad news of the death of Ghislaine's sister Annah in Australia where she had lived since the 1970s.

2012 has seen a lot of travel. In the summer Jacqui took her two boys to Miami to put them on a plane to Brazil to visit their dad. Edgar and his family visited here in June-July. Ed and Ghislaine took a three-week trip to Brazil in October-November, John went to Chile for three months to start a "gap year" kayak school in Pucon. Richard moved to New York where he teaches at Columbia University and performs in various venues.

In June, Ed had cataract surgery on both eyes and for the first time since age 2 can see without glasses.
